She proudly explained in detail the significance of the stories behind the crafts. Emma could connect to every character and story frame. I couldn't hold back my astonishment. How wrong I was to think that this was just an ordinary craft for her. This made me realise how powerful a simple craft can be. It does not just draw out creativity from children, but it helps them learn and understand Christian values. I also understood the powerful mission of catechists, whose apostleship is so central to the Word of God.
