# Short story:

Although her condition improved for a time, the cancer eventually re-emerged, having to rush to hospital in a critical condition a number of times. Each time, she made it through. As the years passed, her condition deteriorated and she could not hold down any food, even of the little she would manage to eat. Maria could no longer cope with her



day-to-day tasks. Maria's doctor suggested that they contact an NGO that provides palliative care for cancer patients, called 'Hospice'. However, it turned out not to be so simple. Maria's husband never really accepted that his wife was so sick. He would at times even scold her and say that she was over-reacting to her symptoms. Moreover, her husband was prone to escape by seeking drink and never gave a helping hand in the house chores. Maria's two adult children would try to help as they could, but since she had pulled through for years, they did not believe, deep down, that she was nearing her end. Maria's son's fiancée observed what was going on and once showed him a DVD on the topic of coming to terms with dying. She also suggested that they get a priest to speak with the family and especially with Maria and administer the Anointing of the Sick to his mother. He was moved to tears by the DVD and agreed to seek out support for his mother and for the family.
